Zambia was the first to do a national malaria survey; we've now done seven, more than any other country

We were the first to introduce combination treatment, now the standard medicine to cure malaria

Zambia devotes more domestic funding to malaria than any other country in the region

Malaria elimination is a Legacy Goal of the Ministry of Health

Our approach has been adopted at the global level to guide countries that are serious about accelerating towards a malaria-free future

There are health facilities in Southern Province that are recording zero local cases of malaria

ON THE FRONT LINES OF ELIMINATION

Central to the Zambia's pursuit of the malaria parasite is the community health worker, serving on the front lines in our fight to eliminate the disease. Chosen by their own communities, these men and women are trained and equipped to follow up positive cases of malaria at the household level.

In Southern Province, more than 60 percent of malaria is now managed at the community level, freeing up facility staff to focus on other health issues. To expand this proven approach nationwide, we need to deploy 10,000 more community health workers.

To grow this army we need you.

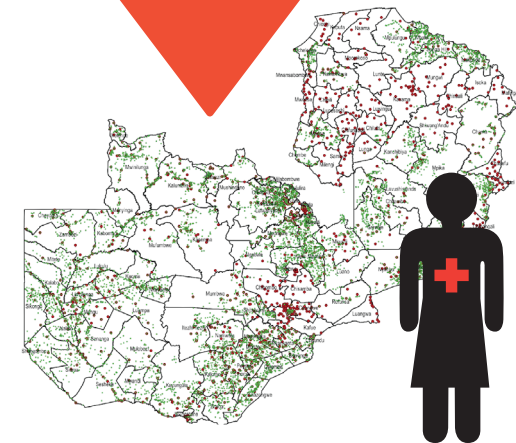
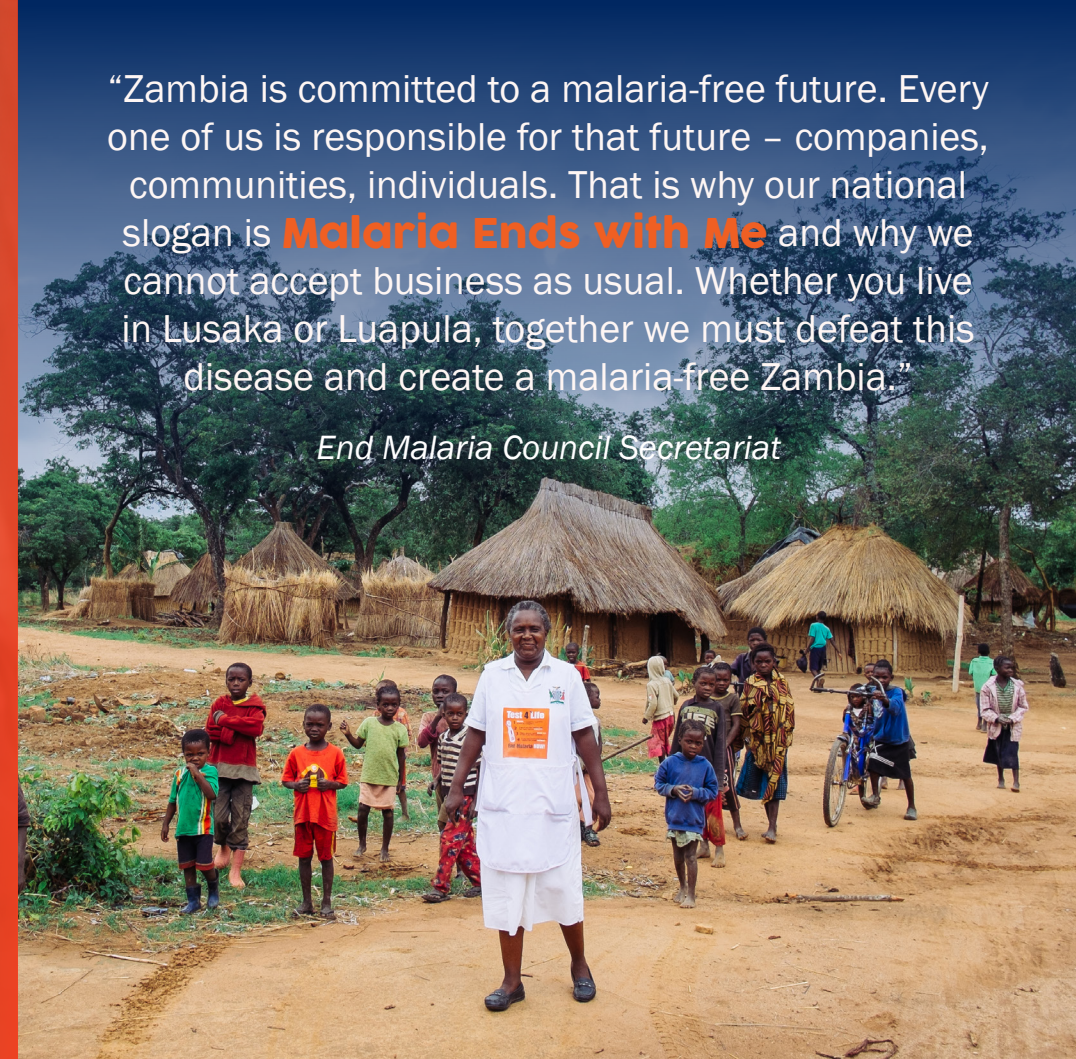
